Please make a black and white copy of the photo provided.

Have all your paints handy.

Round and flat brushes

No masking

A scrubber or softening brush.

I will be working 1/4 sheet size on 300 lb paper but encourage you to have your drawing done ahead of the class on the size and paper of your choice.

The essential pigments are as follows.

Please have a lidded jar with black or mixed black the consistency of whole milk. I use Payne's gray.

Gamboge

Naples Yellow

Aueroline or any cool yellow

Cobalt Teal blue by Daniel Smith

Transparent orange

Opera

Permanent Rose

Quin Magenta

Quin Sienna

Verditer blue.

Mineral Violet

Brown Madder

Greenish yellow or Green Gold

Manganese

Cobalt blue

Helio Cerulean by Horadam Schminke

Indigo

Payne's Gray

Antwerp Blue
